## TCF Children win National awards

Two TCF children received outstanding achievement awards from the Government of Pakistan's NCCWD (National Commission for Child Welfare and Development).

Asghar Ali, an 8-year old student of TCF School – Shirin Sultan Dossa Campus VII in Jam Kando Goth, Karachi received the Takhliqi Award (for creative abilities in Arts, Science and Literature). He received the award for creating a three-dimensional model of a truck made from recyclable material such as empty juice packs, cardboards, wrappers and medicine boxes. Asghar Ali is a creative young boy who has a definite inclination towards arts and crafts.

The other award went to Rehmatullah, a 12-year old student from TCF School-Sabeeh Qamar-uz-Zaman Campus in Tarnol, Islamabad. Rehmatullah won the Himmat Award (for acts of Mental and Physical Courage).

Rehmatullah, at this young age shoulders the burden of running the household with his father. Along with doing every day chores such as filling water, fetching groceries and chopping wood, he also sells corn every evening.

Rehmatullah often comes to school with injured hands and an empty stomach but with eyes that are alight with hope and enthusiasm. He rightly deserves his award for outstanding mental and physical courage.

## Computer Training

Teacher training & development is an important element of the TCF education programme. Recognizing the significance of information technology, we organized a comprehensive computer training for our secondary school faculty, conducted with support from Unilever Pakistan, whose employees volunteered as trainers for the programme. The first training session was held from Jan 19 to Jan 26, 2004 in which 64 principals and teachers participated. The second session was held from April 19 to April 28, 2004 in which 74 more school staff was trained.

## Saqib Khan Completes Marathon des Sables

Saqib Khan, our UK based supporter, completed Marathon des Sables to become the first Pakistani to achieve this honour. Saqib undertook this herculean task with the sole objective of raising funds for TCF. His goal was to raise £35,000 to build a TCF Primary School.

Marathon des Sables, termed as the 'worlds toughest footrace' is a 250 km, 6 day trek across the Sahara Desert amidst 300 metre high sand dunes and stony plateaus. With temperatures soaring upto 54C°, participants are required to carry all necessary equipment including food supplies for 6 days on their back. 32 year old Saqib, a statutory fundraiser for the British Refugee Council, believes that what really kept him going was the thought of all the children whose lives would change once he achieved his goal.

The walk started with over 2000 TCF children (who, thanks to our extremely able and dedicated Area Management staff, were transported in from various parts of the city) singing the national anthem with gusto. The opening ceremony was marked by a poignant speech by Erum Ara, a student of TCF Secondary School Crescent Steel Campus - Umer Maingal Goth, who secured 83% in her Matriculation Exam. Erum, who is now enrolled as a Pre-Medical student, thanked TCF for giving her the chance to pursue her dream of becoming a doctor. A bright and festive atmosphere prevailed throughout the event. There were a host of fun activities at the end of the walk including a wide variety of food stalls, a puppet show, concert by Strings, and comedy show by Black Fish. People from all walks of life enthusiastically joined in the festivities that lasted till late in the afternoon. Prominent personalities such as legendary cricketer Wasim Akram, renowned hockey player Samiullah, eminent writer and critic Adeshir Cowasjee showed support for the cause by actively participating in the event. ## Academic Year 2003 - 2004

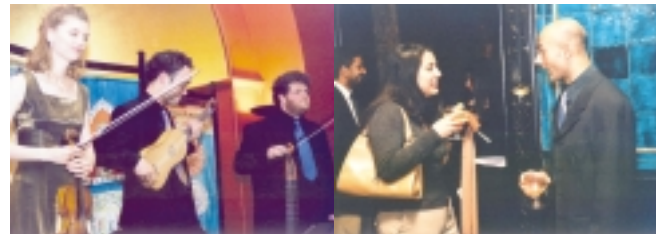
